WELCOME





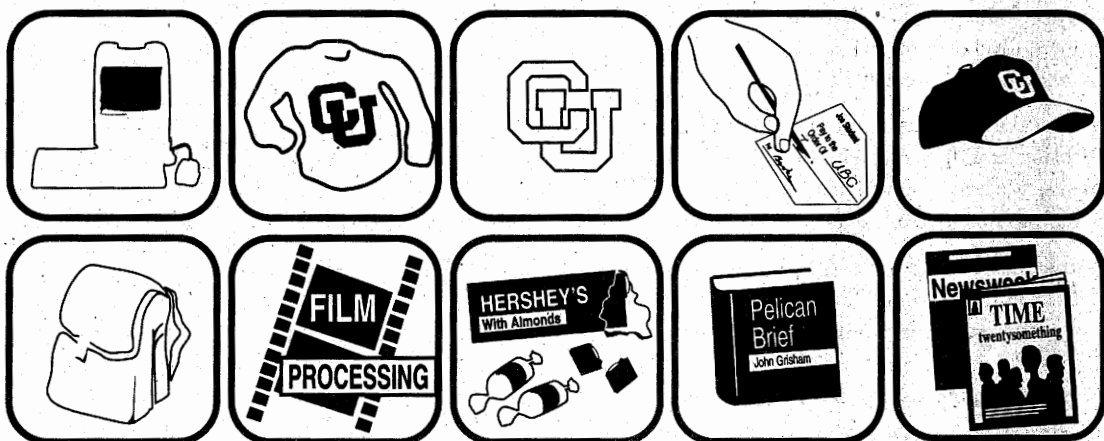
STUDENT ART CONTEST

Laura's painting is entitled *View of Dook'o'oošłiíd (Abalone Shell Mountain) from Twin Arrows, Arizona*. The landscape depicts the western sacred mountain and land of the Diné. The steel arrows represent the stereotyping and exploitation of Native Americans and the land.

The requirements, policies, and course descriptions of each college and school at Boulder are printed in the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*. You are responsible for knowing and following the catalog policies for your year of entry into a specific program at CU-Boulder.

Although this handbook was prepared on the basis of the best information available at the time, *all information is subject to change*. Changes may occur at any time in course meeting times and days or in University, college, or school policies. In addition, classes may be cancelled at any time. It is your responsibility to be aware of such changes by consulting departmental advisors, checking departmental materials, and reading all of your registration materials carefully.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

MARCH 29 (MON.) - APRIL 27 (TUES.)

- Fall 1993 confirmed registration time assignments for continuing degree students enrolled during spring 1993. All continuing students who plan to enroll for fall 1993, including continuing graduate students, should register at this time. Continuing students can continue registering for fall 1993 through August 16; however, for best course selection, students should register as close to their time assignment as possible.

APRIL 28 (WED.) - JULY 14 (WED.)

- Schedule adjustment for continuing degree students who have completed confirmed registration.
- Fall 1993 confirmed registration for new graduate and readmitted students who are not required to attend an orientation.

JULY 14 (WED.)

- **Deadline** (for continuing students only) to withdraw and receive a full refund of their \$200 enrollment deposit (less any outstanding charges). New and readmitted students are not eligible for a refund. (See page 25.)

JULY 15 (THURS.) - JULY 26 (MON.)

- Fall 1993 course-request registration for new freshmen and transfer students (except those in arts and sciences, business, and transfer students in engineering who will attend orientations).

JULY 30 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** to update your summer and/or permanent mailing address to ensure that you receive your schedule/bill at your correct address.

AUGUST 2 (MON.) - AUGUST 16 (MON.)

- Final schedule adjustment for new, graduate, readmitted, and continuing degree students who complete confirmed registration March 29 to July 14.
- Begin mailing schedule/bills and ID validation stickers for all students who confirm registered through July 14. We will continue mailing these to all students who confirm register through August 13.
- Final registration period for new freshmen and undergraduate transfer students in architecture and planning, education, journalism, and music (and new freshmen in engineering) who failed to register July 15-26, or have been admitted since this time.

AUGUST 13 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** to register and receive a schedule/bill and ID validation sticker in the mail. Students who register after this date may pick up their schedule/bill and validation sticker on **August 23**, at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

AUGUST 16 (MON.)

- **Deadline** for all students not required to attend an orientation (undergraduate and graduate) to register for fall classes. **Registration must be completed by 10:00 p.m. on August 16** to be guaranteed enrollment for fall semester. After this date, registration is on a space-available basis, and late fees will be charged.

AUGUST 23 (MON.)

- Schedule/bill distribution only for new freshman and transfer students who registered after **August 13**, who need a revised schedule/bill, or who did not receive a schedule/bill and ID validation sticker in the mail. Open 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., except Tuesday, August 24, until 7:00 p.m., Coors Events/Conf. Center.
- Schedule adjustment begins for those students who registered via course request (new freshmen and undergraduate transfer students only), Monday morning. For all other students who confirm register, schedule adjustment time assignments will begin Monday afternoon. (See page 20.)

AUGUST 24 (TUES.)

- Schedule adjustment time assignments continue. (See page 20.)
- Registration begins for faculty and staff.

AUGUST 25 (WED.)

- Classes begin.
- Schedule adjustment continues (open to all students).

AUGUST 26 - 27 (THURS. - FRI.)

- Space-available (SAVE) registration, Coors Events/Conference Center, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (See page 28.)

AUGUST 27 (FRI.)

- Last day for schedule/bill and ID validation sticker distribution, schedule adjustment, and late registration screening at the Coors Events/Conference Center. Beginning Monday, August 30, these registration services will be located in the Regent basement, room 1B60.

AUGUST 31 - SEPTEMBER 1 (TUES. - WED.)

- Space-available registration for senior auditors, Koenig Alumni Center, Tuesday, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.; Wednesday, 9:00 a.m. to noon. (See page 28.)

SEPTEMBER 3 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** to pay tuition and fees (including room and board, etc.) by 4:00 p.m. and to turn in deferred tuition agreement. No grace period.
- **Deadline** to waive University-sponsored health insurance at Wardenburg Student Health Center. (See page 24.)

SEPTEMBER 6 (MON.)

- Labor Day holiday. No classes.

SEPTEMBER 7 (TUES.)

- **Deadline** to add your name to a wait list. (See page 17.)

SEPTEMBER 10 (FRI.)

The following transactions must be completed by 4:00 p.m.:

- **Deadline** to add a course, including independent study and thesis. This deadline will be in effect unless enrollment levels are reached earlier.
- **Deadline** to drop a course without being assessed tuition and fees for that course and without a W showing on your transcript. After this date, you must be passing your course to receive approval to drop, and you must have the signature of your instructor.
- **Deadline** to change pass/fail and no-credit status on courses.
- **Deadline** to withdraw from school and be assessed only \$200 in tuition and fees. The enrollment deposit is applied to this charge. (See page 25.)

SEPTEMBER 24 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** to withdraw from school and be assessed only 40 percent of full tuition and fees.

OCTOBER 5 (TUES.)

- **Deadline** to drop a class without petitioning your dean, by 4:00 p.m.

OCTOBER 8 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** to withdraw from school and be assessed only 60 percent of full tuition and fees. **After this day, 100 percent of tuition and fees is due.**
- **Deadline** to pay any unpaid balance, including approved deferred tuition, by 4:00 p.m. **No grace period.**

Explanation of Abbreviations Used for Days: Monday—M; Tuesday—T; Wednesday—W; Thursday—R; Friday—F; Saturday—S; Sunday—U. Please check with your instructor for class meeting times that do not fall within the standard meeting patterns.

If you have three or more examinations on the same day, you are entitled to arrange an alternative examination time for the last exam or exams scheduled on that day. Such arrangements must be made *no later than the end of the ninth week of the semester*. You will need to provide evidence that you have three or more examinations to qualify for exceptions.

REGISTRATION OVERVIEW

The Office of the Registrar will conduct two types of registration for fall semester 1993: confirmed registration and course-request registration. Refer to the chart at right to determine when you will register and adjust your schedule.

Confirmed registration is for those students who are continuing with degree programs from spring or summer, as well as for new graduate students, readmitted students, and new undergraduate students registering after July 26. (See pages 14 and 15.) Confirmed registration takes place throughout the months of April, May, June, and parts of July and August. You may drop and add classes anytime after you register, through August 16, with the exception of July 15 through August 1. CU Connect will also be available for you to adjust your schedule once the fall semester begins.

Course-request registration is for new freshman and transfer students registering before July 26. If you are just starting your academic career at CU-Boulder, you will register for fall 1993 via course-request registration (see page 16) during the summer. You will use our telephone registration system called "CU Connect." Your requests will be held and, at a later date, will be run through a series of computer programs to place you into classes. After you have picked up your schedule/bill and ID validation sticker and the semester has begun, you will be able to drop and add classes during final schedule adjustment.

Late Registration

All students must complete registration by 10:00 p.m. on August 16 (August 20 for new freshman and transfer students attending the last orientation session for arts and sciences, business, or transfer students in engineering) to be guaranteed enrollment for fall semester 1993. Students

who don't register by these dates (including graduate students) are subject to late registration. Only students in open categories will be allowed to register late, after payment of a \$20 late fee. Remember, many courses are full by this time. Students can call (303) 492-6970 or 492-6301 beginning August 23 to see if they're eligible for late registration. Students who are eligible for late registration can go to the central drop/add site to be set up. (See page 27.)

REGISTRATION CHECKLIST

Get Ready to Register

- Receive your invitation to register in the mail (only if you will *not* be attending orientation).
- Complete your special services form. Continuing students can obtain a copy of the form when they pick up their registration handbook. All other students who receive their form in the mail may return it in the envelope provided; those who attend orientation may return it at that time.
- Complete the confirmed registration form on page 109 of this handbook.
- Obtain advising, if specified on your invitation to register.
- Clear all "stops" printed on your invitation to register.

Register for Fall Classes

- Using a touch-tone phone, call CU Connect as soon as possible after your time assignment begins. The CU Connect phone number is (303) 938-8110. The function codes are as follows:
The action code is 7003#.
The fall term code is 937#.
- 2* adds a course (*see 6* below if you are a new freshman or transfer student registering for fall 1993 by July 26.*)
- 3* drops a course
- 3# drops your entire schedule (*course-request students only*)
- 5# lists your schedule
- 6* requests a class (*only for new freshman and transfer students for fall 1993 registering by July 26*)
- 7# allows you to search for additional sections, if prompted
- 8# exits you from the system
- 9# allows you to put your name on a wait list, if prompted

To request a course for **no credit**, press *1 between the course call number and #.

To select the **pass/fail** grading option, press *2 between the course call number and #.

These codes are also listed on your schedule worksheet, page 108. Follow the steps on your registration form when prompted.

Adjust Your Schedule Early

- Once you have registered and received confirmation of your courses through CU Connect, you can make any necessary changes to your schedule before the semester begins. Don't wait until you return to make changes!

Pick Up Your Schedule/Bill

- Most students (except new freshmen and undergraduate transfer students) will receive their schedule/bill and ID validation sticker in the mail. If you do, and there are no corrections to your class schedule after you receive it, you no longer need to come to campus and pick up another copy. Affix your ID validation sticker to your CU-Boulder photo ID, and pay your bill by September 3.
- If you did not receive your schedule/bill in the mail, or you have made significant changes to your class schedule after you have received it, you may pick up a new schedule/bill and ID validation sticker on August 23 or 24 at the Coors Events/Conference Center, conference level, as follows:

- Last name A - G, room 1
- Last name H - L, room 2
- Last name M - S, room 3
- Last name T - Z, room 5

- If you need to pick up your schedule/bill on August 25 through August 27, go to the concourse level (upper level), Coors Events/Conference Center. August 30-September 10, pick up your schedule/bill and ID validation sticker at Regent, room 1B60.

Make Final Adjustments

- Try to make all of your schedule changes before you return to campus. If you need to adjust your schedule, beginning August 23:
 - Complete the schedule adjustment form on page 108 of this handbook (page 107 is for practice).
 - Adjust your schedule via CU Connect according to the schedule adjustment (drop/add) time assignment chart printed on page 20. Go to a computer terminal in an academic department (see pages 29 and 30), or go to our central drop/add site at the Coors Events/Conference Center, August 23 through August 27, or go to Regent, room 1B60, August 30-September 10.
 - List your schedule often via CU Connect if you are on a wait list to see if you have been enrolled in the course.

SOME HELPFUL TIDBITS

Did You Know?

When you go to an academic department after the semester begins, you can do all of your drop/add activity for any department or any college at that location. (See pages 29 and 30 for a list of locations.)

When you adjust your class schedule at a computer terminal, the computer operator cannot use call numbers to find, drop, or add courses. It is important that you give the computer operator the four-letter subject abbreviation, the four-digit course number (*not* the call number), and the three-digit section number.

CUline PLUS

• *Look up your record directly on CUline.*
CUline PLUS (Personal Look Up Service) makes it possible for you to access your individual records on line. By entering your PIN and student number, you can now look up your current billing information and verify your current mailing addresses. In addition, work is currently in progress on adding grades and class schedules to CUline PLUS; these features should be available in the fall. You will not have access to any other students' records, only to your own. To reach CUline PLUS, choose PLUS from the main menu and follow the instructions.

Federal privacy laws and University policies guarantee your right to access your own data and protect this data from unauthorized access by others. Unauthorized access can result in student conduct disciplinary actions and/or civil and criminal proceedings. The University will provide reasonable physical and electronic security for this data, but it is up to you to not compromise the security of this information. If you feel that your new PIN is not secure, please contact the registrar's office in Regent 105, and another PIN will be assigned to you.

GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Before you register, please read the following information. Many of the questions you may have about registration procedures are answered here. The information is listed in alphabetical order.

Addresses—Very Important!

- *Keep your addresses updated!*
- *Check your addresses on your invitation to register.*

Throughout your time as a student, we will mail important registration materials to you. Therefore, it is *extremely important* that you keep your addresses updated at all times.

Three addresses on your student record must be kept current if important mailings are to reach you: your mailing address, your permanent address, and your summer address.

Your **mailing address** is your address in Boulder during the school year, *e.g.*, the residence hall, apartment, or house where you live during the fall and spring semesters.

Your **permanent address** most often is your parents' or guardians' residence, *e.g.*, the place you call home during the time you are not attending school. This is the address where your schedule/bill and ID validation sticker will be mailed. It is **very** important that this address be kept correct at all times.

Your **summer address** is your address from the end of the spring semester to the beginning of the fall semester.

Be sure to update your addresses by July 30 for the mailing of your fall 1993 schedule/bill and ID validation sticker.

Please note that you can have a number of address combinations: a different address for mailing, permanent, and summer; or the same address for any two or all three of these categories.

You may look up any of your addresses on CUline and fill out a change of address form at the Office of the Registrar in Regent 105 or in the Financial Aid Office. You can also call (303) 492-6581 to update your address(es). Note that these addresses are only reflected on the student address information system. Other offices, such as the library, housing, and Wardenburg, have separate address systems and changes should be made there as well.

Advising

- *Check your invitation to register for advising requirements!*
- *Please see page 30 for academic advising locations and phone numbers.*

Some CU-Boulder colleges and schools require that you consult with an advisor before registering for courses. A code is set on the Student Information System (SIS) that will prevent you from registering until you have seen an advisor. If you receive such a message on your invitation to register or when calling CU Connect, and you are an arts and sciences or an engineering student, call your faculty advisor, your major department, or your dean's office to make arrangements for advising. If you are a student in any other college or school and you receive an advising message, you should call your dean's office.

After you have been advised, the code on the computer will be removed *by the advisor or the staff in the department or dean's office*, and you may then call CU Connect to register.

If you need help in planning your schedule, check with your college or school's dean's office, or your major department office, and make an appointment to see an advisor. Some colleges, such as arts and sciences, hold workshops for students on general education requirements (core curriculum and college list). Also, the Advising Resource Center has advisors on call to help those of you who

are "open option" students or are thinking of changing your major. And the Office of Peer Counseling in Willard is available to help all students with both academic and personal concerns.

Changing Your Major

- *Request this change at your new department!*

If you would like to change your major or declare a major before you register, go to that department and ask about its procedures. Your change will be entered on to the computer system as soon as it has been approved by the new department. If your change of major involves moving into another college or school, it is considered an intrauniversity transfer (IUT). Please see that section on page 12.

Class Standing

Undergraduate class standing is based on the total number of semester hours passed, as follows:

Controlled Enrollment and Independent Study Courses

- *You must receive permission from the department before registering for these courses.*

If you are interested in taking a course with a 760-799, 800-, or 900-level section number, you will need to contact the department for permission and for the five-digit course call number before you register. Enrollment in these courses is limited by each department.

Beginning Monday, August 23, controlled enrollment and independent study courses may only be added for you by department staff members or via a special action form

(obtained from the academic department), which must then be brought for processing to the registrar's office or to a central drop/add location.

Course Reservation Program

The course reservation program assists you in getting the courses you need to graduate by giving you an opportunity to reserve space in a class. If you remain on a wait list for a necessary fall class through September 10, 1993, you can enroll in that course for spring semester 1994 before your regular time assignment. Most courses included in the course reservation program are undergraduate core curriculum courses that are being offered during spring 1994 by the College of Arts and Sciences. You will be eligible to participate in the course reservation program for spring 1994 if your name is on a wait list for one of these courses as of August 20, or if you add your name to the wait list after the beginning of the semester and you remain on the wait list through September 10. (All restrictions that are placed on the course for the following semester will be honored, and you must clear up any "stops" before registering.)

If you are eligible to participate in the program, you will receive a letter in October inviting you to register for the course November 1 through November 5. You will register for all other courses during your regular time assignment.

Credit-Hour Limits

- Undergraduates may request a maximum of 19 hours of course work during registration.
- Undergraduates may request a maximum of 21 hours of course work during final schedule adjustment.

Undergraduates can only request 19 hours of course work during registration (15 hours for graduate students and 16 hours for law students), including wait-listed

courses. Once you have completed your registration, you should check with your college or school to determine the maximum number of credit hours that can be counted toward your degree each semester. Remember that 12 hours is considered a full-time undergraduate student load for financial-aid purposes.

Undergraduates will be allowed to carry up to 21 hours (including wait-listed courses) during final schedule adjustment.

Credit Options

- You do not receive grades for no-credit courses; however, you still pay full tuition.
- You can make credit-option changes throughout the registration and schedule adjustment period.
- Courses taken for no credit or pass/fail cannot apply towards a graduate degree.

No Credit. You can select classes on a no-credit basis (an *NC* will appear on your transcript in place of a grade) during registration or schedule adjustment.

However, you will still pay full tuition for the course. Please check with your college or school for policies on no-credit status and how it may be used.

Pass/Fail. You will be able to select classes on a pass/fail basis throughout registration and schedule adjustment. Please check with your college or school; there are restrictions on the number and the types of courses that can be taken pass/fail.

Once you have signed up for a course on a pass/fail basis, your instructor is not told—and should not be told—that you are taking the course pass/fail. You will be assigned a grade for the class. A grade of *D*- or above is automatically converted to a *P*; an *F* remains an *F*. Only the *F* is calculated as part of your grade point average; a grade of *P* is not counted.

Note: Should you decide you want to change the status of a course from, or to, either *P/F* or *NC*, please make the change

in the registrar's office or at the central drop/add location. By filling out the change form there, you will not jeopardize your enrollment in the course. If you do this change by telephone, you will not be able to re-enroll in the course if it is closed or a wait list exists for the course.

Variable Credit. When requesting a variable-credit course (one with a range of minimum and maximum credits), you need to decide how many credits you would like to receive for that course. Indicate this when prompted by CU Connect. You can change how many credits you would like to receive for the course throughout registration and schedule adjustment.

Directory Information

- Come to the registrar's office by September 10 to have directory information withheld.

The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) of 1974 protects the privacy of your education records. However, certain information is considered public or "directory" information. Such information may be released to anyone, unless you inform the Office of the Registrar that you do not wish the information released.

Directory information includes name, address, phone number, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in University activities or sports, dates of attendance at the University, full- or part-time enrollment status, degrees and awards received, educational institutions attended, and weight and height of athletes.

To prevent the release of directory information, you must go to the Office of the Registrar by September 10 to request that it be withheld. Once requested, non-disclosure of directory information will remain on your record until you are no longer enrolled at the University or until you request removal of the privacy status. This prevents us from releasing any information to anyone over the telephone.

GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

A complete summary of University policy on the release of student information is available in the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*, the *Student Handbook*, and at the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105. For further information, call (303) 492-6907 and ask for the records supervisor.

Double-Degree Programs

- *If you are working on two degrees, verify that we have this information.*

If you are working in a double-degree program (for example, obtaining one degree from arts and sciences and one from business), you should check to see that both degree programs are entered on the invitation to register you receive in the mail. If both colleges are not recorded, you may not be able to register for required classes during registration. If you have questions concerning your double-degree program, check with one of your dean's offices.

Help Line

If you are having any problems with telephone registration, please call our help line at (303) 492-1033. This number has pre-recorded telephone registration information available 24 hours a day. To speak with someone personally, call between 9:00 a.m. to noon, or 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday during the registration period.

Intrauniversity Transfer (IUT)

- *Check with the dean's office of your desired college or school for admission criteria.*

If you would like to transfer into another CU-Boulder college or school, check with that dean's office for admission criteria and information on enrollment levels, application procedures, and deadlines. Policies vary among the different colleges and schools.

If you have already submitted an IUT application, register as if you have been accepted into the new program. If you are not able to register for some courses because you have not yet been accepted, you may change your schedule during final schedule adjustment.

Parking Permits/ Bicycle Registration

- *If you need to park on campus—whether a car or a bike—you'll need a permit.*

To get a parking permit, you will need:

- a photo ID (preferably your CU-Boulder photo ID)
- your valid state motor-vehicle registration form (no exceptions)
- a current meal sticker or voucher (residence hall students only)

For permit information, call 492-3550; for any parking questions, call Parking Services, 492-7384.

BICYCLE REGISTRATION

Registering your bike is mandatory on campus. Fall bike registration takes place August 22 through August 24 from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the Coors Events/Conference Center, southwest entrance. It continues throughout the semester at the bike kiosk (between Imig Music and Cheyenne Arapahoe Hall), Monday through Friday, 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. For further information, call 492-2322.

Photo IDs

- *Located in UMC 25 and open between 11:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.*

Your validated CU-Boulder photo ID is an important identification card to carry with you. It signifies that you are a currently registered student and allows you to use University services and facilities.

The Photo ID Office is located in the UMC, room 25, across from the Book Center.

To have a CU-Boulder photo ID made, go to the office, Monday through Friday, between 11:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. On August 18, 19, 20, 23, and 24, the Photo ID Office will be open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. On August 25, regular office hours of 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. will resume.

You must have some other form of picture ID with you when you go to have your student ID made. Your initial ID is free, but there is a \$10 charge for replacement IDs. (Continuing education and SAVE students do not receive an initial free ID; these students are charged \$10 for an ID.)

CU-Boulder photo IDs and validation stickers are not transferrable. Any person who uses the CU-Boulder photo ID or validation sticker of another student or

allows his or her validated ID to be used by another student may be subject to disciplinary action. The Photo ID Office will only give out validation stickers when issuing a new or replacement photo ID. Replacement stickers (\$2.00) will only be available from Regent 105.

Special Services Form

- *Continuing students must turn in this form to obtain the registration handbook.*

This form, which allows you to choose special services such as the yearbook, tickets for the Artist Series, and Career Services programs, must be turned in to complete your registration. You do not have to choose any of the services, but completion of the form is a required part of the registration process.

If you are a continuing student, you must fill out the special services form before you can pick up a copy of the *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses*. The special services form will no longer be mailed to you but will be available during the handbook distribution period.

If you are a new or readmitted student, you will receive the special services form in the mail or at orientation (for those students who are required to attend orientation) as part of your registration materials.

If you have not yet completed the form, please follow the instructions for filling it out, sign your name, and mail it via U.S. mail or campus mail. You may also drop it off at the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105.

Stops on Your Registration

- *Check your invitation to register for stops!*

When you call CU Connect, you may get a message that you have a "stop" on your record. Stops are holds that the University puts on student records for various reasons. They originate from financial obligations,

academic concerns, or even disciplinary matters. You will not be allowed to register until all stops have been cleared. Most often, you will know about a stop before calling CU Connect, because a message will be printed on your invitation to register. However, stops can occur at any time in the registration process, so you should make it a point to know the status of your student record.

If you have a financial stop, which indicates unpaid University debts, you may be withdrawn from your classes if you fail to pay your bills. Please check with the Bursar's Office in Regent 150, (303) 492-5381.

If you have been placed on a scholastic stop, check with your dean's office. You won't be allowed to register for fall courses until the stop has been removed.

Time Out Program

For those of you who would like to take a planned leave from CU-Boulder for a semester or a year, the Time Out Program (TOP) provides an opportunity to leave without losing your place in your college or school. You must be in good academic standing and have your dean's approval. Your place will be guaranteed when you return, providing you meet registration and deposit deadlines. An application fee of \$30 is charged. More information is available from the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105, (303) 492-8673.

Note: If you are registered for the semester you plan to begin TOP, you must formally withdraw. See the "Withdrawal Dates/Refund or Assessment Schedule" on page 25.

Transcripts

- *Transcripts may be ordered by phone, mail, or in person in Regent 105.*

If you would like to get a copy of your CU academic record for advising purposes, you may call 492-6907 or fill out a form in the

lobby of Regent Administrative Center to request that an **unofficial transcript** be sent to any department on campus. You may also order a copy for your personal use in the same manner. Copies are available the next working day after the order is placed. Copies can be picked up in the foyer of the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105. The cost is \$1.00 a copy. Rush unofficial transcripts are available for an additional processing fee.

Your **official transcript** is the complete record of all courses you have taken at the University of Colorado, both at the undergraduate and graduate level. It contains the signature of the registrar and the official, embossed seal of the University. Official transcripts are primarily used to support applications for transfer to other academic institutions and for employment purposes.

Official transcripts that include end-of-term grades will be available approximately ten days after final examinations. A transcript that is to have a degree recorded will be available approximately six weeks after graduation.

An **internal transcript**, which includes courses, credits, grades, transfer courses accepted, and grade point average (GPA), will be mailed to your permanent address approximately two weeks after the end of the semester. It is not necessary, therefore, to order an official transcript in order to determine your semester grades.

There is no charge for official transcripts, which are prepared only at the student's request. Typically, official transcripts require a minimum of three working days to process. However, a rush-transcript service is available for a processing fee. Official transcripts may be ordered by telephone request at (303) 492-8987, on request forms in the Regent foyer, or by mail from the Office of the Registrar, Transcript Section, Campus Box 68, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0068.

Most continuing, re-admitted, and new graduate students will participate in confirmed registration for fall 1993. If you do, you will be able to call CU Connect to register for classes, list your schedule, drop and add classes, and sign up for course wait lists. When you register via CU Connect, you will receive immediate confirmation of your enrollment in courses.

1 Receiving Your Registration Invitation

• *This form, which will be mailed if you do not have a required orientation, includes your registration time assignment, your personal identification number (PIN), your addresses, and any stops on your registration.*

A personalized invitation to register will be mailed to you indicating the date and time you can call CU Connect to register for classes. You can call any time after your time assignment begins, through 10:00 p.m. on August 16. However, because confirmed registration is conducted on a first-come, first-served basis, it's to your advantage to call as soon as possible. Classes fill up throughout the registration period.

Registration Time Assignments

Registration time assignments are based on class standing, with graduating seniors receiving the earliest assignments. All other seniors register next, then graduate and law students, first-semester freshmen (those with 12 or fewer hours), juniors, sophomores, and second-semester freshmen. Time assignments are based on the number of hours you have completed at CU-Boulder, including any transfer credit, and any classes you are currently enrolled in (as of February 23). Within these groups, the time assignments are random. Any changes

made after that time (courses dropped or added, additional transfer credit) will not change your time assignment.

2 Filling Out Your Registration Form

• *Located on page 108 (practice worksheets on page 107).*

Use the schedule worksheets in the back of this handbook to fill out a preliminary schedule for fall 1993. Then, fill out your confirmed registration form on page 109 (extra on page 110) before you call CU Connect. It is always a good idea to include additional class schedule choices on your confirmed registration form in case classes you request are full.

3 Getting Academic Advising

If you are required to see an academic advisor (indicated on your invitation to register or on CU Connect), call or visit your department office as soon as possible. You will need to bring your completed confirmed registration form to your appointment. You will not be allowed to register until you have met with your advisor. (See page 10 for more information.)

4 Calling CU Connect

Call CU Connect, (303) 938-8110, from any touch-tone phone. Use the function codes listed on your schedule worksheet on page 108. You may call any time after your assigned time begins. Follow the instructions on the confirmed registration form.

CU Connect is available Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. It is also available on Sundays from 11:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. CU Connect will *not* be available on April 18, 25, May 31, July 4-5, July 26-August 1, and after 12:00 p.m. every Friday, June 11

through July 9. July 15 through July 26 are for course-request registration only.

5 Adjusting Your Schedule

• *Make your changes before you return for classes in the fall!*

Once you have registered, you will be able to make adjustments to your schedule by calling CU Connect and dropping or adding classes. By calling CU Connect, listing your schedule, and making any needed changes during the registration period, you should have the schedule you want when the fall semester begins. Simply follow the CU Connect function codes, described and illustrated on page 108, to add or drop classes from your schedule.

SEARCHING FOR OPEN COURSE SECTIONS

If you request a course section that has been cancelled or is full, the computerized telephone voice will ask you if you want to conduct a search for open sections of that course. If you do, press 7#.

CU Connect will search for another section of the course that is available during the same time period. If one is available, you can place yourself in that section. If one is not available, it will search for any open section beginning with the first section of the course that is open and fits in with your schedule.

CU Connect will continue the search until an open section is found that fits your schedule or until it is determined that no section for that course is currently open and available.

COURSE TIME CHANGES

• *Original sections will be cancelled and a new section added.*

Sometimes academic departments must change the time a course is offered after the *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* has been published. If this is the case, the department cancels the original

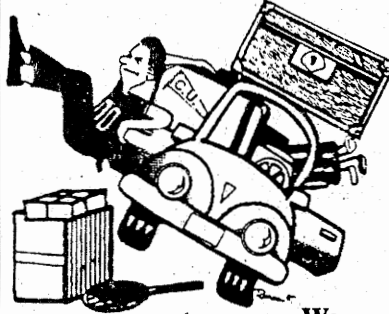
section and add a new section that reflects the time change

If you register for a course and CU Connect tells you the course has been cancelled, please try the search option (7#). CU Connect lets you know if the new section of the course with the time change is available and fits in with your schedule.

LISTING YOUR SCHEDULE

You can list your schedule any time by logging on to CU Connect and then pressing 5#. If you put your name on a course wait list, you will want to list your schedule frequently to find out if you have been enrolled in the class.

COURSE-REQUEST REGISTRATION

If you are a new freshman or undergraduate transfer student registering before July 26, you will request courses for your fall schedule. Some colleges and schools have a mandatory orientation session for new students. If you are a new student and are *not* required to attend an orientation and registration session, registration materials will be mailed to you, and you will be able to request classes during the summer.

1 Creating Your Fall Schedule

Begin with the schedule worksheet on page 108 (practice worksheets are on page 107). Fill out a preliminary schedule, making sure to include alternate course choices. Create a schedule without time conflicts (most Monday-Wednesday-Friday classes are scheduled for one hour, while most Tuesday-Thursday classes are scheduled for one and one-half hours). Include any required labs or recitations in your schedule.

2 Filling Out Your Registration Form

Next, fill out the course-request registration form, which is included in your registration packet. You will have the option of entering an alternate (second-choice) course for each course you request when you call CU Connect. On the course-request registration form, indicate alternate courses that you would like to take if your primary (first-choice) classes are full.

Alternate courses should be entirely separate courses, not just different sections of your first-choice courses. When placing you into classes, CU Connect will automatically search for open sections of any class you enter as a first choice that fit in with your schedule.

3 Getting Academic Advising

If you are required to see an academic advisor (indicated on your invitation to register), you will need to have your completed registration form approved by your advisor before you will be allowed to register.

4 Calling CU Connect

Call CU Connect, (303) 938-8110, from any touch-tone phone. You may call from either on campus or off campus. If you call and CU Connect is busy or not available, please call back.

Dates for course-request registration (refer to your CU Connect course-request form) are restricted to certain periods. If you participate in an arts and sciences, business, or engineering transfer orientation program, you will register during the program. If you are registering from home, CU Connect dates are restricted to July 15 through July 26. You must complete your registration by 10:00 p.m. on July 26. New freshman and transfer students (who are *not* in arts and sciences, business, or engineering transfers) who have not registered by this time should call (303) 492-6970 as soon as possible for instructions on registering at a later time. Lower priority will apply.

5 Fine-Tuning Your Course Requests

The requests you make by telephone are stored in the computer. This allows you to make changes to your requests during the request period noted on your invitation to register. If you haven't made all your changes by 10:00 p.m. on July 26, you will have to wait to make changes until your schedule-adjustment time assignment begins on August 23.

To make a schedule change, you must delete all your requests from the system by

entering 3#: Then, reenter your entire requested schedule in addition to your new requests. Be sure to keep your registration form as a record of the courses you request.

6 Sectioning of Course Requests

CU Connect takes all the course requests made by new students and checks that there are no financial or academic stops on students' records. Then students are placed in courses. The computer must make many determinations before making schedules final, such as space availability and student eligibility.

Space in some highly desired courses, such as certain core courses, has been specifically reserved for new students.

7 Picking Up Your Schedule/Bill

You can pick up your schedule/bill on Monday, August 23. It will not be mailed to your permanent address. Please see page 19 for times and locations. If you received all your desired courses and you don't need to adjust your schedule, you are done. If you still need to make changes, refer to the section on schedule adjustment beginning on page 20. If you need assistance at this time with course selections, refer to the posted course-available lists (see page 20), use the services in the Advising Resource Center (Willard 400) or the Peer Counseling Office (Willard 100), or contact advisors in your major department office.

8 Adjusting Your Schedule

After you have received your schedule/bill, you can make adjustments by dropping or adding classes as needed. The schedule-adjustment period runs for the first three weeks of the semester (Monday, August 23, through Friday, September 10). Instructions for adjusting your schedule can be found on pages 20 and 21.

USING WAIT LISTS

Throughout confirmed registration and schedule adjustment, if you are eligible to take a course, but find it has been closed, you may be able to put your name on a computerized wait list.

A wait list is a registration feature that allows you to place your name on a list for a course that is currently filled but may have openings later in the registration process. Each department determines if a wait list will be offered for a course and what type of wait list will be used. There are two types of wait lists: *automatic* and *resequenced*.

The *automatic wait list* is set up on a first-come, first-served basis. As a vacancy occurs in a class, the person at the top of the list is automatically enrolled.

The *resequenced wait list* uses a priority system to determine who gets to enroll in a course as spaces open up. Priorities, established by the department, are usually based on class standing and/or major.

CU Connect will inform you if a class you have requested has a wait list and will give you the option of adding your name to the list. Simply press 9# when prompted and listen for verification.

Deadlines for Wait Lists

- *Deadline is September 7!*

You will be able to place your name on course wait lists through 10:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 7. At that time, all wait lists will be frozen.

If you are automatically enrolled from a wait list (September 7 or earlier) into a class that you no longer want and fail to

drop it by September 10, you may be charged additional tuition for the class based upon your number of credit hours. Also, if you do not attend a course you have been enrolled in, you will receive an *F* for that class.

If you still want to be enrolled in a class as of September 8, please check with the department offering that course. You must let the department know you are still interested in the course, should an opening occur. **There is no automatic enrollment from wait lists after September 7.**

Wait Lists for Labs and Recitations

- *You must be enrolled in all parts of a lecture/lab/recitation by September 10!*

If you are closed out of a lecture course that has a lab or recitation, you can only be placed on a wait list for the lecture portion of the course. Once you are enrolled in the lecture course from the wait list, you must then add the lab and/or recitation via CU Connect.

The system refers to labs and recitations as "second- and third-level activities." You must be enrolled in required labs and recitations by September 10, the last day of schedule adjustment.

Wait-List Positions

When you place your name on a wait list, the total number of students already on the list is announced. As wait-list positions constantly change during the registration and schedule-adjustment periods, specific position information cannot be made available until the week of August 23.

If you choose not to remain on a wait list, please drop your name from it as soon as possible by entering 3*. Other students will be waiting to enroll in the course.

Wait Lists—Important!

- *It is your responsibility to find out if you've been enrolled from a wait list into a class.*

If you place yourself on a wait list during registration or schedule adjustment, it is your responsibility to call CU Connect to find out if you have been enrolled in the class. When a space opens up for you from a wait list, you will be enrolled automatically in the class. No verification will be sent.

You must check your schedule via CU Connect periodically to confirm your enrollment. Simply press 5# after logging onto the system.

Remember: If you find that you have been enrolled in a course that you no longer want, please drop it as soon as possible so other students can enroll in the class.

Wait-Listed Courses

Placing your name on a wait list does not guarantee that you will be able to enroll in the class. Depending on the total number of spaces and the demand for each particular course, spaces may or may not become available at a future time. If you are on a wait list for a course, we recommend that you meet with your academic department to select several other choices that may apply toward your degree program. You may go to the registrar's office in Regent 105, to the Events Center, or use CUline (see page 20) to check lists of all available classes, open classes that meet core curriculum requirements, and open classes by meeting time.

GETTING YOUR SCHEDULE/BILL

Most students will receive their class schedule/bill and ID validation sticker in the mail. Students who register after August 13, and new freshmen and undergraduate transfer students for fall, will not receive their schedule/bill and ID validation sticker until August 23 at schedule/bill distribution.

If you receive yours in the mail, and there are no corrections to your class schedule after you receive it, you no longer need to come to campus and pick up another copy. Affix your validation sticker to your CU-Boulder photo ID and pay your bill by September 3.

If you do not receive this form in the mail, or you make changes to your class schedule after you receive it, you may pick up your schedule/bill and have your ID validated on August 23, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (and August 24 from 8:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.) at the Coors Events/Conference Center, conference level, as follows:

- Last name begins A - G, room 1
- Last name begins H - L, room 2
- Last name begins M - S, room 3
- Last name begins T - Z, room 5

On August 25 through August 27, you may pick up your schedule/bill at the upper level, Coors Events/Conference Center, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Beginning August 30 and thereafter, pick up your schedule/bill at Regent, room 1B60.

Validating Your ID

Students who receive their schedule/bill in the mail will also receive their ID validation sticker. Please affix your ID validation sticker to your CU-Boulder photo ID.

If you did not receive these things in the mail, you may pick up your schedule/bill and have your CU-Boulder photo ID validated at the Coors Events/Conference Center beginning August 23.

If you add more than one course and need a fees-paid sticker after receiving a no-fees sticker, you may obtain the proper validation sticker in the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105.

There is a \$2 charge for replacing validation stickers. **Note:** CU-Boulder photo IDs and validation stickers are not transferrable. Any person who uses the CU-Boulder photo ID or validation sticker of another student, or allows his or her ID to be used by another student, may be subject to disciplinary action.

Understanding Your Schedule/Bill

Your class schedule lists the courses for which you are registered. If a message instead of a course title is listed or a course you requested does not appear, it means you are *not* registered for that course.

Some of the reasons you may not have been enrolled in a course are listed at right.

"STUDENT INELIGIBLE FOR COURSE"

• **Class Restriction.** Class enrollment may have been limited to students who should have earned a certain number of hours by the end of the fall semester or by class level. Class restrictions are not likely to change during the schedule-adjustment period.

• **Controlled Enrollment.** Special authorization was required from the department before requesting this class. See the department with questions.

• **Major Restriction.** Enrollment was limited to students in specific majors, colleges, or schools. These restrictions are not likely to change during the schedule-adjustment period.

"COURSE CANCELLED"

Either the course or the section you requested was cancelled. Contact the department for additional information or try adding a different course or section.

ADJUSTING YOUR SCHEDULE

You may use CU Connect to list your schedule and to make changes during your registration period, as well as during final schedule adjustment (the first three weeks of the fall semester, August 23 through September 10).

Time Assignments for Schedule Adjustment

As class schedule/bills are now mailed to most students approximately three weeks before the start of classes, time assignments during the final schedule-adjustment period will now be based upon the last two digits of your student number. **This time assignment is for both computer terminals and for CU Connect.**

Time assignments ensure that we will not have too great a volume of students calling CU Connect, or going to computer terminals, at one time. Schedule adjustment (drop/add) time assignments are indicated below and will **not** appear on the class schedule/bill you will receive in the mail.

Time assignments will be strictly enforced.

The system will not allow early transactions; therefore, you will *not* be able to drop or add classes before your time assignment. In addition, time assignments will be rotated each semester to ensure fairness.

Adjusting Your Schedule

Complete the form on page 111 of this handbook, filling out call numbers, department abbreviations, and course numbers of classes that you want to drop and/or add to your schedule. Because there will be many closed courses, you should have several second-choice courses available. Lists of available courses can be found at the central schedule-adjustment site (Coors Events/Conference Center), as well as in the lobby of Regent. You can also look up available courses on CULine.

If you would like to add a controlled enrollment or an independent study course, you will need to go to the department offering the course. Staff there will either be able to enroll you in the course on-line or will give you a special action form to take to the central drop/add location.

Looking for Available Classes on CULine

To look for available classes at any time during the registration and schedule-adjustment periods, you can access CULine from a computer terminal. CULine will list courses that are open, and entries will be updated regularly.

Terminals dedicated to CULine are located in the lobby of Regent Hall, the UMC, Norlin Library, College of Business, Fleming Law, College of Music, the Recreation Center, the Engineering Center, and most of the residence halls. Computing labs in Business, Engineering, Ketchum, Muenzinger, Norlin, and Physics also have CULine access.

On most computers, you will be able to log on to the system by pressing the **Break** key. If you have any difficulties, computing advisors can help you at (303) 492-1615.

Once the connection has been established, do the following:

1. In response to the terminal prompt
UCB ISN NETWORK
SELECT A RESOURCE:
type **CULINE** and press **RETURN**.
2. The terminal will respond with
TRYING...
CONNECTED
You must press **RETURN** again.
3. When you receive the prompt
USERNAME:
you again type **CULINE**,
and CULine will start up.
4. From the menu, choose
STUDENT ADMIN INFO
by moving the cursor down with the
arrow keys and pressing **RETURN**.
5. At this menu, select
COURSE AVAILABILITY

You may look at all available courses offered for fall, all available arts and sciences core courses, or courses available in order of time offered. You can also use CULine to look up final examination schedules, check your billing information, or check your address.

Adjusting Your Schedule at a Computer Terminal

To change your schedule at a computer terminal (during the schedule-adjustment period of August 23 through September 10), go to any of the following computer terminal locations set up throughout campus after your time assignment begins. A photo ID is required to change your schedule at a computer terminal.

Take your schedule/bill, your completed schedule-adjustment form, your registration handbook, and a personal ID with you to a terminal.

When adjusting your schedule at a computer terminal, you must have the course subject, the course numbers, and the section numbers; *call numbers are not used at computer terminals*. Refer to your completed schedule-adjustment form.

Changing Credit Status

If you want to make a section change or a change of pass/fail, no credit, or variable credit status, remember to make these changes at a central schedule-adjustment site. This is for your own protection! In order to make any of these changes over the phone or at an academic department, a course must be dropped and then immediately added. If you make these changes by phone, there is the possibility you won't be able to add the course back once you have dropped it. Please make these changes at the Coors Events/

Conference Center (August 23 through August 27) or Regent 1B60 (August 30 through September 10).

Adjusting Your Schedule by Phone

- You may drop and add classes via CU Connect any time after your schedule-adjustment time assignment begins.

To adjust your schedule by phone, follow the same procedures you used to register. (See the CU Connect Codes on page 108).

The deadline for dropping and adding classes for fall semester 1993 is 4:00 p.m., Friday, September 10. After that time, no adds will be permitted unless there are extenuating circumstances, and no tuition adjustments will be made for dropped classes. Please make your changes early to avoid the deadline rush.

After September 10 and through October 5 (4:00 p.m.), you must be passing a course to drop it, and a special action form must be completed and signed by your instructor and turned in to the registrar's office.

After October 5, you cannot drop a course unless there are circumstances clearly

beyond your control (accident, illness, etc.). To drop a class after October 5, you must have your instructor's approval as well as the approval of your dean. Their signatures must be on your special action form, or your request will not be processed.

Deadline for Wait Lists

You will be able to place your name on wait lists through 10:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 7. After that date, wait lists will be frozen. If you are on a wait list as of September 8 and are still interested in taking the class, you should check with the department offering the course.

You must let the department know you are still interested in the course, should an opening occur. There is no automatic enrollment from wait lists after September 7. All department wait lists will be cancelled at 4:00 p.m. on Friday, September 10, the last day to drop and add classes.

Wait Lists—Important!

Remember to check CU Connect for your wait-list status. It's easy to do! Simply call CU Connect after your time assignment begins to list your schedule or go to a terminal to check your status. If you forget that you are on a wait list and are placed in a class and do not drop it by September 10, you may be charged tuition for the class, and you will receive an *F* if you do not attend.

Administrative Drops

Administrative drops are initiated by departments. If you have not met all the prerequisites for a course, or if you do not attend your courses regularly during the first few weeks, you may be administratively dropped from any course. Please check with departments for policies concerning administrative drops.

Note: If you stop attending a course without officially dropping it, you will receive a grade of *F* in that course.

TUITION AND FEES

Do you need to know how much you owe on your tuition and fee bill?

Has your financial aid been applied to your bill and is a refund check available to pick up?

What is the due date of the next tuition and fee bill, and what happens if yours is past due?

All these questions can be answered by accessing CULine PLUS anytime, includ-

ing nights and weekends, at various terminals located around the campus. If you have any questions regarding tuition information on CULine PLUS, please call the Bursar's Office at (303) 492-5381.

to Master's Candidate (6940-6949) or Ph.D. Dissertation (8990-8999), refer to the graduate tuition chart below for your assessment.

In-State: Students enrolled in only Master's Candidate (B Grad Status; course numbers 6940-6949) will be assessed tuition at the following flat rate: Business, \$516; Engineering, \$525; Law, \$588; MBA, \$540; all others, \$456.

Students taking only Ph.D. Dissertation (E Grad Status; course numbers 8990-8999) will be assessed tuition at the same in-state rates as listed in the graduate tuition chart.

Students registered as approved doctoral candidates (D Grad Status) will be assessed tuition at the same in-state rates as listed in the graduate tuition chart.

Out-of-State: Students taking only Master's Candidate (B Grad Status; course numbers 6940-6949) will be assessed tuition at the following flat rate: Business, \$1,086; Engineering, \$1,092; Law, \$1,128; MBA, \$1,107; all others, \$1,056.

Students registered as approved doctoral candidates (D Grad Status) and those taking only Ph.D. Dissertation (E Grad Status; course numbers 8990-8999) will be assessed tuition at the following rate, multiplied by the number of credit hours of enrollment: Business, \$362; Engineering, \$364; Law, \$376; MBA, \$369; all others, \$352.

Understanding Tuition Charges

• *After September 10, there will be no tuition adjustment for courses dropped. However, tuition for classes added will be assessed and billed.*

A tuition surcharge is assessed for every credit hour over 18.

Tuition for a no-credit course is the same as for a course taken for credit.

Tuition for a 0-credit-hour course is charged at the rate of a 1-credit-hour class.

Tuition for a nondegree student who has a degree is charged at the graduate rate.

Residency

If you're an out-of-state resident seeking in-state classification for fall 1993, you should turn in your residency petition by 4:00 p.m., July 30, 1993, to the Tuition Classification Office in Regent 105, Campus Box 68, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0068.

Petitions will still be accepted through August 27, 1993, but you will not receive a decision by the tuition-payment deadline. Adjustments will be made if your application is approved.

Students submitting a completed petition by May 14, 1993, will receive a decision by the enrollment-deposit refund deadline of July 14. If you are a financial-aid recipient seeking in-state classification, be sure to submit your petition by May 14 to make sure your financial-aid award is processed in time for fall semester.

Complete information regarding the requirements for in-state residency status is available from the Tuition Classification Office, Regent 105, or by calling (303) 492-6868.

UCSU Student Fees

(Note: The following fees are from 1992-1993 and are given only as approximations. The actual fees are established during budget meetings each May.)

Mandatory UCSU student fees of \$172.10 are considered as important as tuition and may only be waived due to extraordinary circumstances. If fees are waived, students must still pay the base fee of \$33.47. Students who wish to petition for a waiver of UCSU fees must do so by 4:00 p.m. on September 3. *No late petitions will be accepted.* Petitions may be picked up and turned in at the Bursar's Office, Regent 150, and must include documentation of the reasons for waiving the fees. **Note:** Students covered by the student health insurance cannot have their full student fees waived.

UNDERSTANDING STUDENT FEES

All Boulder main-campus students taking one course or 5 or fewer hours will be assessed a base fee of \$33.47 and will receive a base-fees sticker for their ID. These students will not be allowed to use Wardenburg services or the Recreation Center unless they pay separate, one-time user fees or full student fees. Doctoral students taking thesis hours only and master's candidates for degree taking thesis hours only will be assessed only the base fee, unless they have the student health insurance and then they will pay full student fees. Approved doctoral candidates will be assessed only the base fees unless they have the student health insurance, and then they will pay doctoral fees of \$85.01.

Mandatory Fee Information

In addition, all students are assessed an RTD bus-pass fee. The fee (\$11 a semester for all students) entitles you to free unlimited ridership, using your validated student ID, on local and express bus routes. To ride the regional routes, you'll need to pay \$1 each time.

Also, students registered for 4 or more credit hours are assessed an athletic fee of \$33 each semester. Students are also charged a nominal fee for basic computing and information services. Students enrolled for 6 or fewer credit hours are charged \$5; students enrolled for 7 or more credit hours are charged \$10.

Matriculation Fee

There is a one-time, nonrefundable matriculation fee of \$15, which is assessed at the time of initial registration, for students entering a program and for new degree students. The matriculation fee covers processing charges for adding or dropping courses and for official transcripts. Nondegree students who are admitted to degree status are assessed the

matriculation fee at the time of their first registration after they have become degree-seeking students.

Enrollment Deposit

Your \$200 enrollment deposit will be held for you until you graduate or officially withdraw from the University within established dates and guidelines. (See page 25 for the "Withdrawal Refund or Assessment Schedule.") At that time, the deposit will be credited toward any outstanding financial obligations you have, and a refund will be mailed to you within approximately eight weeks.

However, if you elect to enroll at the University in the semester following graduation, your enrollment deposit will remain on your account. It will be refunded to you when you are no longer enrolled.

Student Health Insurance

All students enrolled for 6 credit hours or more will automatically be assessed for student health insurance. The student health insurance plan provides up to 100% coverage for eligible medical costs incurred at Wardenburg Student Health Center (WSHC). It provides 75 to 100 percent coverage, after a deductible is satisfied, at other medical facilities, depending upon the type of service rendered and the provider. The plan provides up to \$250,000 in coverage per illness or injury on a world-wide basis. Benefits are provided all year round when both fall and spring semester coverage is purchased.

If you are taking 5 or fewer semester hours, or are enrolled in the SAVE, Continuing Education, or Time Out Program, the University-sponsored health plan is available at the same price that full-time students pay. To become eligible to

purchase the insurance, you must first pay full UCSU student fees. **Exception:** Approved doctoral candidates requesting student group insurance will be charged full price for the insurance, and UCSU student fees may be reduced. However, if UCSU student fees are waived, students are not eligible for reduced rates at WSHC. Students wishing to enroll in the student health plan with 5 or fewer semester hours, or who are enrolled in the programs listed above, need to sign up at WSHC.

If you hold at least a twenty-percent appointment as a teaching, research, or graduate assistant, or as a graduate part-time instructor, you are eligible for a contribution toward the student insurance. The University will contribute a portion of the cost toward either Option A or B.

If you do not wish to purchase the student health insurance, you may complete a waiver to remove this charge from your bill. To be honored, waivers must be turned in to WSHC by September 3, 1993. (Waivers submitted in fall 1993 will extend through spring semester 1994.) Late registrants must submit waivers within two weeks from the date their first tuition bill is mailed.

Note: You *must* complete and return a health-insurance selection/waiver form to WSHC. If you fail to return this form, *you will automatically be assessed the fee for Option A of the student insurance plan.* Please call the Student Insurance Office at 492-5107 if you do not receive the selection/waiver form in the mail.

Waivers turned in by July 20, 1993 will be reflected on the schedule/bill mailed on July 30, 1993.

PAYING YOUR BILL/WITHDRAWING

To pay your bill, make out a personal check, certified check, or cashier's check to the University of Colorado. Make sure your name and student number are on the check. Mail the check with the top portion of your bill to the Denver post-office box noted on the bill, or use one of the tuition drop boxes in the lobby and at the north and south entrances of Regent. *Do not use campus mail.* The payment deadline is **4:00 p.m. on Friday, September 3.**

Permanent drop boxes are located outside Regent Administrative Center at the north and south entrances. The boxes are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, for any bills owed to the Bursar's Office.

There also will be tuition-payment drop boxes at the deferred-tuition area in the Coors Events/Conference Center from August 23 through September 3.

If you are using the U.S. Postal Service, please mail your payment early. **The University must receive your bill by September 3.** Postmark dates are *not* honored. If you do not receive a tuition and fee bill, you are still responsible to know the amount of your bill and to pay on time.

If you must send payments via express mail, send them to the Bursar's Office, Regent Hall, Room 150, University of Colorado at Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309.

Tuition Payment Option— Deferred Tuition

If you foresee any problem in paying your bill in full by September 3, you can elect to defer up to one-half of your balance due. By completing and returning the deferred tuition agreement located on the reverse side of your schedule/bill, you will be allowed to pay only one-half of the amount due on September 3. You will need to pay the remaining balance plus a 1 percent finance charge by October 8, 1993.

If you do not receive a schedule/bill in the mail, or if the deferred tuition agreement is not part of your schedule/bill, you may also defer your tuition at the Coors Events/Conference Center, August 23 through September 3, between 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. (except 8:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on August 24).

Failure to Pay in Full by the Deadline

University policy requires us to place a financial stop on your record if you fail to pay your full tuition and fee bill by the published deadline. This stop will prevent you from registering for any future terms, receiving your diploma, or receiving a transcript of your work at the University. Also, you may be withdrawn from the University for future terms.

Colorado law requires the University to place all delinquent accounts with the state's Collection Office. If your account is referred to a credit agency, you must pay any collection costs allowed by the Uniform Consumer Credit Code.

A late-payment charge, in addition to a service charge on the unpaid balance (1 percent per month), will be assessed according to the following schedule:

Personal Check Policy

Any student writing a bad check to the University may jeopardize future registration and may be subject to late charges and service charges. A \$17 returned-check charge will be assessed, in addition to the amount due to the University. The student also may be liable for collection costs and prosecution under the Colorado Criminal Statutes. CU-Boulder is a member of the

Boulder Credit Bureau. Specific inquiries concerning reporting should be directed to the Student Debt Management section of the Bursar's Office.

Withdrawal Procedures

If you need to withdraw from fall semester 1993 before August 25, you can fill out a withdrawal form in the registrar's office or write a letter to the Withdrawal Coordinator, Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 7, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0007.

If you withdraw on or after the first day of classes (August 25), you must complete a withdrawal interview. The interviewer will discuss procedures for withdrawing and your reasons for leaving. You won't need to drop your classes; that will be done for you.

If you don't officially withdraw, a failing grade may be recorded for all of your classes. **Remember:** Deadlines and rules for withdrawing may vary with each college and school. Check with your dean's office.

Tuition assessments for first-time students with financial aid may differ from those listed below, due to enactment of the Higher Education Amendments of 1992, Part G, Section 484B. Please check with the Bursar's Office at (303) 492-5381.

March 29 - July 14	Full refund of enrollment deposit (<i>for continuing students only</i>). New, readmitted, and transfer students are not eligible for a refund.

September 11-September 24	40% of full tuition and fees is assessed, or the \$200 enrollment deposit, whichever is greater.
September 25-October 8	60% of full tuition and fees is assessed, or the \$200 enrollment deposit, whichever is greater.
October 9 and thereafter	No refund. 100% of tuition and fees due.

FINANCIAL AID

If you meet all of the qualifications to receive your student-aid funds, then your scholarship or grant will be applied automatically to your schedule/bill. See CUline if your aid does not appear on your bill.

Refund Checks

Checks for financial-aid funds in excess of your University bill will be available at the Coors Events/Conference Center, **August 23 through September 3, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.** (until 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 24). Beginning September 7, you may pick up your check at the Bursar's Office in Regent. Checks for the balance of funds will *not* be mailed.

Perkins Loans

If you are awarded and accept your fall Federal Perkins Loan and sign your promissory note, your loan will be applied to your bill. If you did not sign the promissory note, you may do so at the Coors Events/Conference Center from **August 23 through September 3, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.** (until 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 24).

Beginning September 7, you may sign your promissory note at the Office of Financial Aid, Environmental Design, room 2. If you have questions about Federal Perkins Loans, call (303) 492-5091 and press *H.

Emergency Short-Term Loans

Emergency short-term loans are available through the Office of Financial Aid for students whose aid funds are delayed or who have experienced a shortage of funds to meet some expense.

To qualify, students must be at least 18 years of age, be enrolled at least half-time on the Boulder campus (SAVE and continuing education students are not eligible), and must present a photo ID. All loans must be backed by financial aid or have a co-signer who is either a faculty or staff member or a student at CU-Boulder. The maximum amount that can be borrowed is \$350.

Federal Stafford and SLS Loans

Federal Stafford Loan and Supplemental Loan for Students (SLS) checks will be available in the Coors Events/Conference Center from **August 23 through September 3, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.** (until 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 24).

If you are borrowing a Federal Stafford or SLS for the first time at CU-Boulder, you will be given a packet of information regarding your responsibilities in borrowing federal funds. *You must read this information before being given a check.*

If you are an undergraduate student in the first year of your program, or a transfer student with less than 30 hours at CU-Boulder, and are borrowing a Federal

Stafford Loan or SLS for the first time at CU-Boulder; then your loan funds will be available after 30 days of the semester have passed. Plan accordingly so you will have sufficient funds to pay your bills by the deadlines.

We anticipate in the near future that loan proceeds for some students (depending on the lender) will be applied directly to the University bill. These funds will be disbursed from lenders directly to student accounts through electronic funds transfer. Any amount in excess of the University bill will be available in the form of a financial-aid refund check.

Reasonable Academic Progress

In order to receive financial aid, you must maintain reasonable academic progress toward a degree. The policy is published in a fact sheet and is available at the Office of Financial Aid, Environmental Design, room 2.

Veterans' Benefits

If you are entitled to veterans' benefits, it's important that you write or call Veterans' Services, Office of Financial Aid, Campus Box 106, CU-Boulder, Boulder, CO 80309-0106, (303) 492-7322.

Automated Phone System

If you call from a touch-tone phone, you may request services or receive information (day or night) from our automated phone system. Call 492-5091 and press 1 and 1 again to access your own financial-aid file. Have your student ID number and PIN ready. From 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, you may call and press *H to speak with a financial-aid advisor. If you call and press 2, you will get Student Employment. Avoid lines and waiting for advisors. Use the automated phone system!

OTHER REGISTRATIONS

A number of different registrations are held each semester for specific categories of students. If you have questions about any of these special registrations, please call the number listed in that section or see the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*.

Concurrent Registration

- Obtain forms in Regent 105 beginning August 16.

If you plan to take at least one course at CU-Boulder in the fall but cannot register for all course work required for your degree program, you may be able to register concurrently on another CU campus. The course work must be required for your degree program, you must have your dean's permission, and enrollment levels must not have been reached on the other campus. Graduate students must also have their advisor's approval. If all these conditions are met, you can register for up to two courses or 6 credit hours, whichever is greater, on another CU campus.

Note: Graduate students should check with the Office of the Registrar for exceptions to the home-campus registration requirement and limitation on credit hours at the host campus.

Concurrent registration forms and instructions will be available at the registrar's office in Regent 105 beginning August 16 from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. You cannot register concurrently until after schedule adjustment has begun on the other campus. Boulder students pay Boulder tuition rates for all classes. For information, please call (303) 492-6581.

High School Nondegree Registration

The high school nondegree program is coordinated by the Division of Continuing Education. Registration is held through

the SAVE program. Please contact Continuing Education at (303) 492-5148.

Intercampus Registration

If you would like to take course work on another campus of the University of Colorado, you may be able to register directly on that campus. However, you must apply for admission to that campus and follow its registration procedures. Please check with your dean's office for approval. (Students in the College of Arts and Sciences may not register at the Denver or Colorado Springs campuses except in the summer.)

Late Registration

To be guaranteed enrollment for fall 1993, all continuing students and some new students must complete registration by 10:00 p.m. on August 16. New freshman and transfer students attending the final arts and sciences, business, or engineering (transfer only) orientation must register by August 20. Students who don't register by these dates (including graduate students) are subject to late registration. Only students in open categories for late registration will be allowed to register, and lower priority and a \$20 late fee will apply. Continuing students can call (303) 492-6970 beginning August 23 to see if they're eligible for late registration. Those who are eligible go to the Coors Events/Conference Center. New students must go to Admissions Processing, Regent 1B65.

On-Campus Registration

- *Deadline to register is August 16.*

Students who are not required to attend an orientation and who have not received registration materials for fall before August 13 may pick up registration materials in Regent 105 between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Telephone registration must be completed by 10:00 p.m. on August 16. This registration does not apply to students who must attend the final

required orientation program. For more information, call the registrar's office at (303) 492-6970.

Registration for Faculty and Staff

All permanent faculty and staff members at CU-Boulder may take 1 to 6 free credit hours each year. The academic year begins with summer session, and the number of free hours is determined on a prorated basis from full-time employment status. Enrollment is usually held on a space-available basis in conjunction with late registration (beginning August 24), unless the faculty or staff member wishes to register early. In that case, registration takes place via CU Connect before August 16, and full tuition and fees are charged.

Faculty and staff members who wish to take a course as nondegree students will need to take a copy of their current personnel action form and a nondegree student application to the Bursar's Office, Regent 150, by July 23, 1993. Office hours are 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (Faculty and staff who are enrolled as nondegree students on the Boulder campus during spring semester 1993 will be set up automatically for fall 1993, although application for free credit hours must be made separately each semester.) A current PAF is required for each semester for which a waiver is needed.

Student activity fees will not be charged if registration takes place during late registration, with the exception of the student computing fee of \$5 or \$10 (depending on the number of credit hours taken). Finally, a charge of \$11 for an RTD bus pass will be assessed of all students, including faculty and staff registered as students.

Course work must be taken outside of scheduled working hours or an adjusted work schedule must be established that is acceptable to the employing department. For more information, call (303) 492-4369 or 492-3048.

Space-Available (SAVE) Registration

Boulder campus classes may be taken by nondegree students on a space-available basis. Registration takes place at the Coors Events/Conference Center, August 26 through August 27. Tuition charges are identical to CU-Boulder rates, and payment is due in full upon enrollment.

Exception: Out-of-state students who want to register for only 3 credit hours or less can do so at the in-state tuition rate by registering through SAVE. (Students registered for 4 hours or more through SAVE will be assessed at the regular out-of-state tuition rate.)

Through the SAVE program, students register for Boulder main-campus courses, but they pay Continuing Education for those courses.

Newly admitted degree students who haven't completed a semester on the Boulder main campus can choose this option but must register as nondegree students through SAVE and reapply through the Office of Admissions when they want to return. These students need to be aware of the number of hours they can take as nondegree students that will transfer to a degree program. 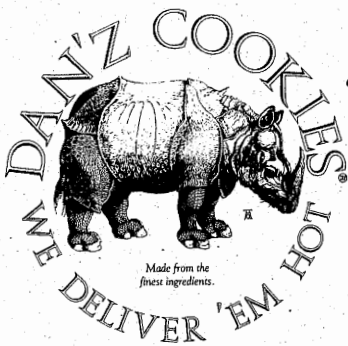

UNDERSTANDING COURSE LISTINGS

The following course listings run the length of the entire two-page left column and the entire two-page right column.

Reminder: The course call number is in the middle of each row of course listings, between the section number and the time/days of each course.

Understanding Course Numbers

Courses are numbered according to the following guidelines:

1000-2999	Lower-division courses (generally appropriate for freshmen and sophomores).
3000-4999	Upper-division courses (primarily for juniors and seniors).
5000-5999	Courses primarily intended for graduate students, but may be open to qualified undergraduates under some circumstances (see individual professors).
6000-8999	Courses open to graduate students only (see individual department offices for special provisions).

Understanding Course Listings

The headers at the top of each column of course listings, in order from left to right, include:

Core Diamonds—A diamond (◆) appears to the left of courses offered for the College of Arts and Sciences core curriculum.

Department—The department name, abbreviated to four letters.

Course Number—The four-digit number used to identify the course.

Credits—The number of credit hours offered for the class.

Course Title—Often abbreviated. Refer to the catalog for the complete title and course description.

Section Number—This three-digit number refers to the specific meeting pattern of the course. The three-digit number alone is the lecture number. When an R precedes the section number, it indicates that the section is a recitation (rec); when an L precedes the section number, it indicates that the section is a laboratory (lab). When a rec or lab section is indicated, it must be taken in addition to the lecture. Some classes have all three: lecture, lab, and recitation.

Call Number—The five-digit number, specific to a particular term, used for requesting a specific section of a course via CU Connect.

Time/Days—Meeting time and days of the class (T is Tuesday, R is Thursday, and U is Sunday).

Building/Room—The building name and room number where the class meets (see the campus map for building abbreviations).

Instructor—The instructor's name, when available.

Maximum Enrollment—The maximum number of students allowed to enroll in the course.

When a course has a prerequisite and/or a corequisite, a note (*in italics*) appears just after the course title. Additional course notes are inserted into each course listing, as needed.

Remember: Some courses may not be available to you because of college or school restrictions or because of class-size limitations. Should this be the case, CU Connect will inform you with an appropriate message.

Building abbreviations are now included on the campus map on page 117.

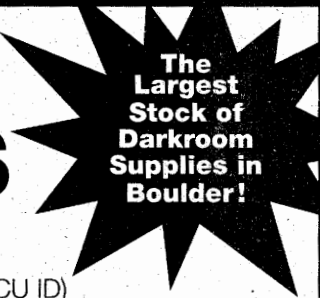

The core curriculum must be satisfied by all students in the College of Arts and Sciences who began their undergraduate study in the summer of 1988 or later. Those students who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must also meet the college's minimum academic preparation standards, or MAPS (see page). You may *not* use courses taken to complete a MAPS deficiency to fulfill any area of the core curriculum, with the exception of foreign language.

There are eleven requirements of the core curriculum—four in skills acquisition and seven in the content areas of study. Each requirement is designed to assure that you have attained a minimum level of competency in that area. The requirements are all listed below, with instructions and lists of courses that will fulfill each requirement. **Courses in bold are scheduled to be offered during fall 1993.** For a complete explanation of graduation requirements in the College of Arts and Sciences, see the University catalog.

Selected majors are exempt from portions of the core curriculum (see sections 4, 5, and 6 of the content areas of study). If you choose to use a major exemption, you may use course work from your major department to fulfill only one additional content area.

All students must complete at least 15 semester hours of course work at the upper-division level as part of the core curriculum, except for specified majors. No more than 6 of these hours may be in a single department. (Content area and upper-division exemptions may be used cumulatively if you are graduating with more than one eligible major.)

Although a single course may appear in several areas, you may use it to meet only one requirement.

You may use courses from a single department to meet no more than two content areas of study in the core curriculum.

As these requirements and course offerings are subject to change, please consult the dean's office in the College of Arts and Sciences for more information.

Skills Acquisition

1. FOREIGN LANGUAGE

While in high school, all students are required to demonstrate third-level proficiency in a single modern or classical foreign language. If you have not met this requirement at the time you enter the college, you will be required to meet the deficiency by passing an appropriate third-semester college course or by passing a CU-Boulder-approved equivalency examination.

2. QUANTITATIVE REASONING AND MATHEMATICAL SKILLS

You are required to demonstrate minimum competence in quantitative reasoning and mathematical skills (QRMS) by the end of your sophomore year. You can fulfill the requirement by passing one of the courses or sequences of courses listed below or by passing the CU-Boulder QRMS proficiency exam.

3. WRITTEN COMMUNICATION

Students entering the College of Arts and Sciences beginning in summer 1992 or later may meet this requirement by:

- Passing the written communication proficiency test.
- Passing UWRP 3020-3 during your junior or senior year.

Continuing students enrolled in the College of Arts and Sciences before summer 1992 should consult a core curriculum brochure published in spring 1992 or earlier.

All continuing students who have not completed this requirement are advised to take UWRP 3020-3 during their junior or senior year.

4. CRITICAL THINKING

You must take 3 hours of specified course work at the upper-division level that requires you to practice sustained critical thinking and to demonstrate such thinking in both written form and oral discussion. 5. NATURAL SCIENCE (13 HOURS MINIMUM)

The natural sciences requirement, which consists of 13 hours of approved natural science course work, includes one two-semester sequence of courses and at least 1 credit hour of an associated laboratory or field experience.

No more than two lower-division courses may be taken from any single department (1-credit-hour laboratory/field experience courses are excepted). In the context of the natural sciences requirement, EPOB, MCDB, and NASC are considered as one

Students who major in the natural sciences (Biochemistry, Chemistry, EPOB, Geology, Kinesiology, MCDB, or Physics) are exempt from completing the natural sciences requirement and are exempt from 6 of the 15 upper-division semester hours required in the core curriculum. MINIMUM ACADEMIC PREPARATION STANDARDS

All new students entering the University of Colorado who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must meet the minimum academic preparation standards (MAPS) specified by their school or college. The purpose of these standards is to assure that all students have some core knowledge in common.

The College of Arts and Sciences has adopted the following standards for admissions. These standards are defined in high school years.

English	4 high school years (including 2 in composition)
Mathematics	3 high school years (2 in algebra and 1 in geometry)
Natural Science	3 high school years (including 2 in lab science, one of which must be chemistry or physics)
Social Science	3 high school years (including one of U.S. or world history and one of geography. A student who has U.S. history may use 1/2 year of world history and 1/2 year of geography instead of one year of geography)
Foreign Language	Completion of a third-year level course (level III) in a high school foreign language sequence

Policies Concerning the Completion of MAPS

If you were admitted to the College of Arts and Sciences with missing MAPS courses, you are subject to the following policies:

- Each year of missing high school work can be made up by one semester of appropriate CU-Boulder course work.
- All course work taken toward fulfillment of the MAPS must be taken for a letter grade and you must receive a passing grade.
- **You are required to enroll in and complete at least one MAPS course each term**, beginning in your first term of enrollment, until such time as all MAPS requirements are completed. This policy applies to new freshmen, to transfer students, and to students transferring from other colleges or schools on the Boulder campus and from other campuses of the University. Failure to comply with this requirement will result in suspension at the end of the term in which you cease to complete missing MAPS courses.
- All students who first enroll in one college or school at CU-Boulder and who subsequently transfer to another college or school will be required to meet the MAPS specified for the new college or school, irrespective of their completion of MAPS courses in their previous college or school.
- Double-degree students must meet MAPS requirements of both degree-granting colleges or schools.
- During the arts and sciences orientation, you must consult with a CU-Boulder academic advisor to determine which specific courses may be used to meet a MAPS requirement.

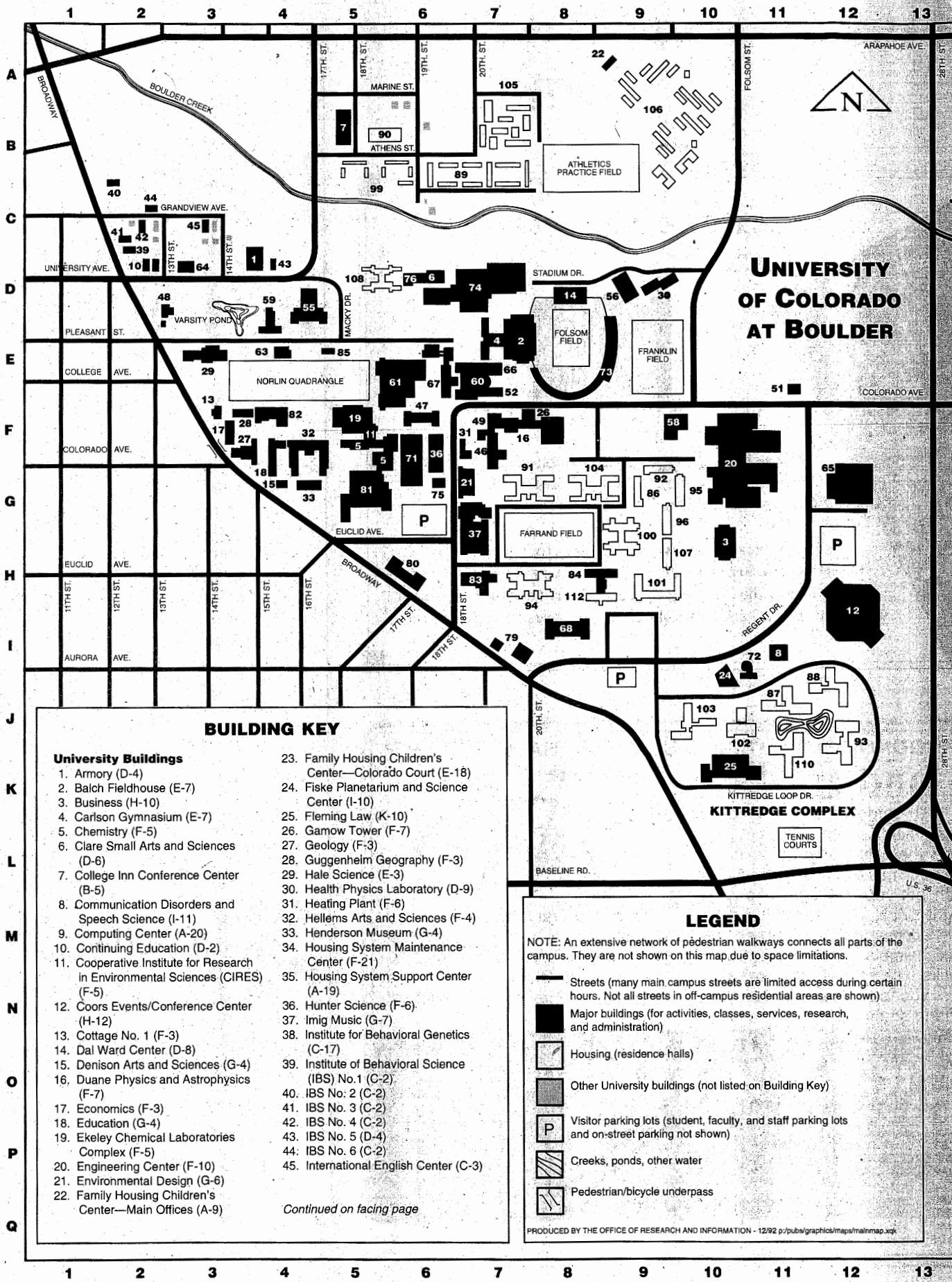

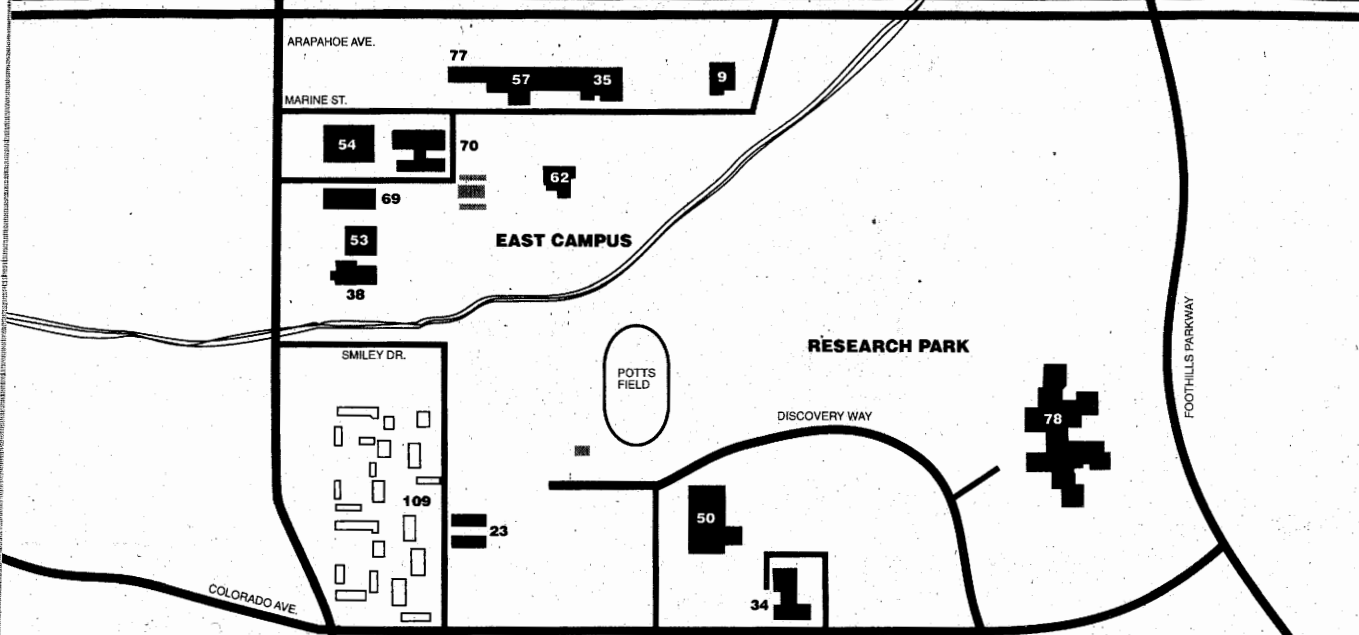
